# 2023 ANNUAL REPORT PRINCE RUPERT PUBLIC LIBRARY

### 2023 CHIEF LIBRARIAN REPORT

2023 was a year focused on building for the future. We identified priorities and goals based upon community input, rebuilding processes, and strengthening relationships between the Library Board, library staff and patrons. It's important for the Library to assess how well it's meeting the demands of the public and how programs and collections answer the information needs of our users.

To ensure that we are doing this we have been working on a strategic plan, far longer than planned due to COVID, but in late 2023 we finished our consultations and review. Except for final touches we were finished and the 2024-2025 Strategic Plan was officially passed in January 2024. We will use this plan to guide us in both our near future and use it as a starting point for the next multi-year plan.

In the summer of 2023 the Library Board and CUPE staff began negotiating for a renewal of the Collective Agreement. A Memorandum of Understanding was agreed to by both negotiating committees prior to the end of 2023. The intention is that the final contract will be signed in 2024. Here are some specific highlights worth noting from 2023:

• We, along with all other Libraries in BC received a significant one-time provincial Enhancement Grant of approximately \$270,000 that will enable the Library to upgrade equipment, improve collections, programs and services over 2024 and 2025 in a manner supported by our Strategic plan.

• We resumed staff First Aid training after a few years of little to no upgrading, which included Basic First Aid and CPR training. As well, staff had Naloxone administration and overdose prevention training.

• We also focused upon greater awareness about Library events, collections and programs through social media promotion.

• There was an significant increase, more than a doubling, in the number of of children's program sessions and attendees in 2023 over 2022.

• We've also seen about a doubling of examination invigilation requests in 2023 over 2022. We were the only institution offering this service in Prince Rupert in 2023.

• One of the first expenditures through the above grant began in 2023. This project started with a patron's reference question, then helped by elders from the community of Metlakatla Alaska, our Library purchased the digital images of the entire correspondence of William Duncan (of both Metlakatla BC and Metlakatla Alaska) from Library and Archives Canada. This important part of the history of both BC and Alaska will be accessible to our patrons in 2024.
